





Express Entry

Determine Eligibility

Before applying, ensure you meet the eligibility criteria for one of the three programs mentioned above. This includes factors such as age, education, language proficiency (English or French), work experience, and adaptability.



Create an Express Entry Profile

Create an Express Entry profile on the Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada website. This profile includes information about your skills, work experience, language ability, education, and other details. Based on this information, you'll be assigned a CRS score



Receive Invitation to Apply

The CRS scores of all candidates in the Express Entry pool are ranked. Periodically, the IRCC conducts draws and invites candidates with the highest CRS scores to apply for permanent residency. If you receive an ITA, you'll have a limited time to submit a complete application.



Submit Permanent Residency Application

Once you receive an ITA, you'll need to submit a complete application within the specified timeframe. This includes providing all required documents such as police clearance certificates, medical exams, and proof of funds



Application Assessment

Your application will be assessed by the IRCC. They will verify the authenticity of your documents, check if you meet the eligibility requirements, and assess your admissibility to Canada.



Medical and Security Checks

As part of the assessment, you and your family members will need to undergo medical examinations and security checks to ensure you meet Canada's health and security standards.



Receive Confirmation of Permanent Residence (COPR)

If your application is approved, you will receive a Confirmation of Permanent Residence (COPR) along with a visa counterfoil (if applicable). This will allow you to travel to Canada and become a permanent resident.



Land in Canada and Activate PR

Once you arrive in Canada, you'll need to show your COPR to the Canadian Boarder Service Agency Officer. The officer will make sure you're entering Canada before or on the expiry date shown on your COPR, make sure you are the same person who is enterning to Canada with proper documents and still meet the requirements of the immigration program. After the interview process, officer will validate your PR status, and you'll officially become a permanent resident of Canada.
